4. STRUCTURE & GOVERNANCE

Society Development Agency (SDA) is being operated by a legal constitution which has been approved by its' General Body. The General Body comprised of 21 members while the Executive Committee (EC) comprised by 7 members. The EC indeed is the supreme authority. The EC is elected by the General Body for 2 years. The Executive Committee (EC) is registered as Board of Trustee (BoT).

There are seven members of 'Board of Trustees' whose are the founder members of the organization. Among these seven, the board comprising with a President, a Vice-President, one General Secretary, one Treasurer and three General Members. The BoT is authority to select an Executive Director among them or hire a competent person from outside. The Executive Director acts as the functional office bearer and represents the board in all legal, financial, programs and administrative issues. The trustee board sits in meeting in every two months for reviewing

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organizational matters. They also sit in AGM in every year and monitor the advancement of the organization.

7. ORGANIZATIONAL CAPACITY & OPERATIONAL COMPETENCIES

7.1 Physical Facilities

7.4 Training Center

SDA has been operating Training and Resources Center (cum-guesthouse) located at the central point of Patuakhali district town. TARC is developing the human resources and contributing for capacity development of professionals as well as providing residential facilities for development practitioners and visitors. It has AC and Non-A/C guest rooms for 70 bedded coverage with dining

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and entertainment facilities. SDA Training Center located at much secured place and congenial environment with accommodation and recreation facilities for trainees and trainers.

8. OPERATIONAL MANAGEMENT SYSTEM & AUDIT

8.1 Management System

Society Development Agency (SDA) has developed adequate manuals/formats and procedures for proper financial management. It's adopted a fair sufficient Accounts Management System consultation with donors, Social Welfare Department and others related agencies and GOB rules & regulations. SDA follows accounts management system. It has formulated its own account management manual approved by EC and GC. The Organizational bank account is operated jointly by General Secretary/Executive Director, Executive member & Senior Assistant Director. The Accountant of SDA maintains the whole account of organization with assistance of others Accountants. All accountants are qualified and well trained from training institute. Each project is audited after completion of project through NGO Bureau enlisted firms. Program Annual Reports are also prepared annually. These reports are submitted to different government departments and donors as required.

Society Development Agency (SDA) maintains proper books of accounts and records for efficient and transparent financial management. These are maintained on an accrual basis. Activity- based subsidiary records for monitoring the detail accounts/key indicators also maintained. SDA has established procedures and adequate records to monitor the progress of the program and control program assets in accordance with sound accounting practices. SDA has internal audit and monitoring units with well-structured internal control systems.

8.2 Financial Management Capacity

Society Development Agency (SDA)'s present capacity is sufficient to operate a proper financial management. It has qualified and trained Accountants. SDA has developed adequate manuals and procedures for proper financial management. A monitoring mechanism developed for effective monitoring. The reporting formats designed for adequate reporting. The Organization is maintaining a mother accounts in Schedule Bank at District level and every Branch has branch accounts. All transaction has been maintaining through requisition system and analysis their demand. Through performing demand we arrange a cheque in favor of the individual Branch within stipulate period.

8.3 Auditing System

Each every end of the financial year organization has arranged for audit through chartered accountant firm enlisted by NGO affairs Bureau. All accounts and funds of the organization is audited properly as per the provision of the bye-laws of the organization approved by the concerned registration authority. An authorized audit firm is appointed for the purpose. All audit reports is available for inspection. There has a system of internal audit. All accounts has been audited by the internal auditor of the organization during the audit period, he will check & verify the all accounts, register, cash & ledger book, voucher etc. After visiting s/he will submit written report. The registered accounts firm will do every year external audit.

8.4 Books of Accounts maintain and Procurement Systems

The organization maintain separate bank accounts for general fund and project fund, project fund accounts are different for each project. The organization strictly follows Accounts policies and procedures and maintain following books of accounts regularly like: 1. Tally Software 2. General Ledger, 3. Bank book, 4. Bank reconciliation statements, 5. Purchase Ledger, 6. Fixed asset register, 7. Cheque Register, 8. Stock ledger/cards, 9. Others: Used Money Receipt, Challan Book, and Purchase requisition Form, etc.

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The organization follows Calendar Year from July to June and Accounts audited by audit firm at the end of the year, i.e. after 30 June of every year. The audit reports are preserved carefully at the organization. The organization has procurement policies. The policies are different in General Fund procurement and Project base procurement. Under the policy Procurement Committee is also formed when necessary.

8.4 Accountability System

SDA always maintains its all programs by transparency and integrity in fund management which are given in details.

This organization has an approved constitution to regulate and maintain all sorts of activities. It has a general body, which is mainly responsible to the government as well as the development partner and beneficiaries. There is an executive committee to govern all the activities taken as development initiatives. Executive committee is accountable to the general body. Executive Director is the member secretary of this committee he has to design, implement and handle all the income and expenditure related works. He is accountable to the executive committee and he has to ensure all the necessary to the target groups for his activities too.




Figure 1 SDA Recruitment Process

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10. RISK MANAGEMENT & FLEXIBILITY

Risk is an apprehension based on some logical forecasting that may threatens or limits the project to achieve its immediate or long term goals, or the production of project deliverables in planned manner. In other sense this is something which may happen and if it does, will have an adverse impact over the project.

Truly, risk management always been a complex task. Still, SDA with its long 25 years work experience with different project components, multi-level management, unpleasant political environment, various community complexes, geographical difference, frequent climate change and multiple communication tracks now it is clear that risk management is not a too much complex task. Inside the communities, now we are the expert in apprehending risks and learned from projects to manage as well, our long sustainability and growth is the evidence here.

Now, risk management is our integral program planning part where we follow the stages; Risk Identification
Risks quantification & Assessment
Risk Response
Risk Monitoring and Control

We ensure the monitoring of effectiveness of the strategies and the changing levels of risk throughout the project. Thus, we believe that it is the best, to hold regular risk reviews to identify actions outstanding, risk probability and impact, remove risks that have passed, and identify new risks. We are capable to make a risk management plan depending on the nature of risk occurrence in this project in a short space of time.

SDA shall take all sorts of precautions from their part to minimize the probable risks. We take the responsibility for ensuring the quality during implementation within the timeframe. We are capable of demonstrating flexibility to cope-up with any new situation. Our long relationship with local administrations, social leaders and good rapport with communities always becomes an asset here.

Every year different types of natural disaster shit in these specific areas and all these natural disasters directly hit the agricultural at first, as a result the farmers loss their crops, poultry, fishes livestock, land, household resources and even their professions. They fall in a great danger and cannot fulfill their daily needs regarding the life and livelihoods to ensure their food security properly. All these changes threaten the food security, livelihoods, health and education especially of the poor and lower middle class families.

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13.2 Future Working Focus

Adjusting 7 thematic area, currently SDA is focusing following 5 programs more to save most affected communities through taking multi of projects and hence mobilizing fund and other plausible resources to implement and fill up the thematic objectives and target:

- **D)** Humanitarian Program-As SDA is localized at coastal reason of Bangladesh, sever catastrophic cyclones, tidal surge and big depression hit almost every year, now SDA is giving more focus to strengthen its humanitarian programs and contribute more to comprehensive humanitarian response and recovery program. Hence SDA is mobilizing relevant resources and fund to accomplish more programs on the working arena
- **B)** Housing & WASH- SDA has paramount experience to work on housing project as well as WASH & health related project, currently SDA is implementing a two years long project on the housing, DRR and WASH facilities in partnership with Habitat For Humanity International, coming years SDA will give emphasis to support the distress coastal inhabitants implementing more Housing and WASH focused project in partnership with national and international donor agencies.
- **C) DRR, Climate Change & Environmental Degradation** Bangladesh is prone to high intensity of climate impact and most vulnerable countries out of the world, where coastal region of Bangladesh having with possibilities of sea level raising that will impact the coastal livelihoods and make suffer the people a huge, So SDA is putting focus on mitigating impact through taking multi of project and programs DRR, CCA & environmental issues.
- **D)** Livelihood, Food Security & Nutrition -As the people of coast is impacted by several hazards, their livelihoods, food security and nutritional uptake being interrupted a huge, recent COVID-19 pandemic has put added suffering the with existing socio-economic conditions, So SDA is focusing to take program on the issue same and to uplift the status of livelihood, food security and nutrition.
- **E)** Education & Awareness Rising- Along with the basic education, Knowledge and awareness on DRR and other projection consensus is integral for the coastal inhabitants covering DRR, climate change, food security, nutrition, IGAs and other life skills education and training. 
